It's quite easy to fall into the same trap with the accounts of Jesus' birth that we have too. Christmas cards can be so unhelpful in this regard. The wonder of God coming among us is actually made more wonderful when we grasp that he did so through the lives of ordinary people who found themselves in extraordinary times!

When we think of Mary as the young woman going about her life in her village, planning to be married soon and to continue the pattern of living that her mother and hers before her had lived without any

them as ordinary people called to make extraordinary decisions, the more the reality of their circumstances and the impact their experiences must have had becomes clearer.

The personal nature of God's intervention in the lives of these ordinary people that begins the world changing events of the life of Jesus is part of the pattern we receive through the Bible and through the ages of how God works in our world. While kings (presidents and politicians) battle out

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their reigns, ordinary people with God at work in their lives do extraordinary things - most often unnoticed... until later.

It may be our first response to worry for the UK when we see statistics, such as the 2021 census, that seem to point to an institutional, even systemic decline in those professing to be Christian. And it is a worry that the decline in the influence of Christian values can be seen to be paying its toll on the life of the nation. But the real story, as it always has been, is told through the individual lives of ordinary people who follow their call to be Jesus' people in the communities in which they live. A single statistic never paints the real picture. All the churches I have ever been part of have been characterised by a desire to express their faith in hope and goodness in the communities they serve. Of course, to give and keep on giving is no easy thing especially when faced with indifference. But it is because God is part of our lives, day in and day out, and because He gives and keeps on giving that we have the drive to do the same. Never tire of doing what is good, St Paul encourages us.

It's also really important to remember that the UK has made some... interesting decisions recently! (I'll let you fill in the specifics about what interesting means!) Globally, the Christian faith is growing... by about 30 million this year to around 2.56 billion people! (Click here for the source). It's also an interesting observation that in 1900, 95% of


Christians lived in a Christian country... that figure is now closer to 50% meaning that we are being called to live out our calling and our faith among those who do not yet know how wonderful it is to live in the grace and love of Jesus. So, Jesus' followers are becoming more dispersed... maybe to where we need to be? In a dynamic and changing world, the Spirit is always at work!

So, as we continue through Advent toward our Christmas celebrations, let's do so with an increased sense of who we are called to be for God wherever we are called to be. Jesus intervenes in our ordinary lives in extraordinary ways to help us to be part of his invitation to a life lived under his amazing grace. His truth that we are loved and blessed by God; that the power of prayer and His presence transforms lives and situations - bringing real strength, peace and hope to real people - remains a constant in a changing world. We have the benefit of each other, our church families and communities to encourage each other in living out our callings as his followers; we have the benefit of nearly two thousand years of experience of seeing Jesus at work and to see the Holy Spirit moving. So, let's continue to pray for the renewal of the UK and all nations and let's be encouraged that with Jesus our lives can be ordinarily extraordinary!!

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The Adventures of Mrs Mop, back in Albania



On Friday 4th November when I went to get my ticket for the "Flying Dolphin" to Sarande, the travel agencies were competing, so I got a ticket for just 15€ instead of the normal price of 19€. Arriving in Sarande at 8:30am Maria met me at the port and we caught the bus to Ksamil where her son Genti was waiting. The weather wasn't so bad, but we were so busy chatting away that it was dark before we knew it and so we didn't go for our usual walk up to the point that overlooks St. Stephanos Bay in Corfu. The next day was stormy, but never mind we had lots to talk about not having seen each other in three years apart from a 1¹/₂ hour surprise pop in earlier in the year. It always touches me to see how people with little give so much in hospitality. Maria fed me up and made a wonderful Albanian meat pie.



So, we had a good time of friendship and fellowship and Maria read in Albanian the prayers in Ephesians chapter 1 and 3 which were so appropriate to what we had been talking about. She's been through more bereavement and is still grieving. When people ask how she stays so strong with all that's happened, she replies that God is bigger than her problems. Waiting for the bus back to Sarande on Sunday morning we discovered that they ran on a different schedule, which meant I would miss

the boat back. There was also a lovely Australian couple waiting, so we shared a taxi together.



Though it was too late to catch any of the Sunday services I walked up to the church where Richard served which was on the ground floor of an apartment, to discover that it had now become a private house. Next door I noticed a cross on the wall and thought to myself that they must have moved there. Anyway, it turned out that it was a Grace Baptist church. The Pastor Aaron and wife Candi and his family were just leaving but kindly welcomed me in. Another "Wilson family" from America with seven children!

He kindly drew directions to where the church had moved to and gave me a few booklets of John's Gospel and Romans written side by side in both Albanian and English. He also gave me the church card and I gave him one of HTC. So, that was the way this trip rounded off and I now have a little supply of something to give away for next time!

It was Maria that introduced me to her sister and family in 2006 who were in great need, and we at HTC were able to help by sending food and clothes and buying them a fridge. For which they are forever grateful for the love shown. That was sixteen years ago. And wow,

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God answered our prayers in wonderful ways by both provision of a decent house, and fellowship with other believers.

As always greetings come from Maria who asked about the church, so I was able to tell her how excited we are about Café Logos.


