Dear Friends,

The turning of the year is one of those times when we are caused to take a step back and look at who we've been over the year that has passed and think about who we hope to be in the year ahead on both a personal and collective level. In a way, the collective hopes at the moment are all too clear. We hope and pray for peace in all those places we remember in our prayers and for a turning in the economic situation that is making most of us deeply concerned. At a personal level, we will no doubt be entering the new year with a very familiar set of good intentions that we often return to when thinking of an upgrade for ourselves. At times it may feel that both these sets of collective and personal would-be goals seem equally inaccessible to us. Should we be looking at this in a different way?



During Epiphany, with a sneak preview in the carols, we are encouraged to consider again how in the Magi the "wisdom of the world" kneels before the "wisdom of God". The wise men, seeking a king who will usher in a new age of peace and prosperity, follow the signs only to have their expectations turned upside down. It isn't the power of gold that will bring about the transformation that they are hoping for but the power of prayer (frankincense) and of sacrifice (myrrh). In a way this makes perfect sense - it's hardly wise to expect change to come from continuing to do the same things! And our world has developed a very rehearsed modus operandi with many vested interests ensuring the continuation of the status

quo! But as the Magi wrestle with what it could possible mean that the Prince of Peace, Wonderful Counsellor, Almighty God has set aside heavenly glory to be born into the exposure and risk of conflict and poverty, I wonder if they reached the truth, that what was being modelled for them in the most startling way... that our souls deepest desires are only realised when we set aside our own crowns and allow ourselves to be formed through prayer into servant hearts like His?

WORKS IN PROGRESS

Jesus' promise, that if we seek first His Kingdom and lay aside our anxieties over our day-to-day material needs and wants, we firstly take hold of through faith - faith in Him and the picture he paints that this life is but a beginning; that we are spiritual works in progress. But it is also received in wisdom. In a world where the impact of greed, lust and the abuse of power are increasingly transparent on a massive scale, it would be foolish to believe that continuing in that way will bring about any change at all - let alone any spiritual development for the soul of humanity. Kindness, faithfulness and service in this context seem a blindingly obvious alternative! And in moments of reflection and inner hunger, when our spiritual eyes are open and our aspirations are turned towards the deeper parts of ourselves, why would we want anything else?

CUSHIONED COMFORT

And yet as pastries are to the diet and the comfy couch to the resolution of fitness, so the fears and anxieties of the world are to the risk of daring to live trusting in the wisdom we find in prayer with a servant heart. And as with so many aspects of our lives, it's not who we imagine we could be when we sit in the cushioned comfort of our im-

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aginations that counts; it's the choices and decisions we make when we are going about our daily lives with the very real people and situations in which we live. Keeping ourselves constantly mindful of our souls' aspirations and the reality that true wisdom must lie in following the One who came among us to show us a different way, is probably the best resolution we can make. God is with us. His Spirit abides within us and constantly offers an alternative way through this life and the power and wisdom to walk in the footsteps of the

Servant King. Remembering that truth and that the source of true Wisdom is always there within, may well be the only resolution we need to keep. The rest will follow.

Praying for a blessed, peaceful and spiritually fruitful year for us all.



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


